# A Special Note from the Executive Director at CASA Of Elkhorn Valley

What is CASA? CASA means Court Appointed Special Advocate. Since its creation by a juvenile court judge in Seattle, Washington, CASA has become one of the most effective advocacy programs of its kind. Today there are almost 950 CASA programs in 49 states. With more than 96,000 volunteers across the country, we are all committed to the rights of every child in the foster care and child welfare system.

The mission of CASA of Elkhorn Valley: Training, empowering, and inspiring Volunteer Advocates to represent children in court who have experienced abuse or neglect and ensure they are safe, have a permanent home, and the opportunity to thrive.

## What does training to be a CASA Volunteer look like?

CASA volunteers undergo a thorough training and development program that consists of at least 30 hours of pre-service training, followed by 12 hours of yearly in-service training. Volunteers learn about courtroom procedures from the principals in the system, including judges, lawyers, social workers, court personnel, and others. CASA volunteers also learn effective advocacy techniques for children and are educated about speci c topics ranging from seminars on child sexual abuse to discussions on early childhood development and adolescent behavior.

After completion of the initial training, volunteers are sworn in as o cers of the court. This gives them the legal authority to conduct research on the child's situation and submit reports to the court.

### How can I get involved?

CASA Of Elkhorn Valley is always looking for individuals like you who want to get involved. Email executivedirector@elkhornvalleycasa.org, stop in the o ce at 115 N 5th St in O'Neill, or call 402.340.3185 and speak with Monica Huber to nd out all of the ways you can help.

### If I were to donate monetarily, how is my money used?

We have a responsibility to our community and our donors and work hard to ensure long-term sustainability of the organization. We make our IRS Form 990 available for review, as required by law.

### In what other ways can I donate?



# NEBRASKA PAID SICK TIME NOTICE OF EMPLOYEE RIGHTS

### NEBRASKA HEALTHY FAMILIES & WORKPLACES ACT | EFFECTIVE DATE: OCTOBER 1, 2025

#### **ENTITLEMENT & AMOUNT**

Beginning October 1, 2025, employees are entitled to paid sick time.

Employees begin accruing paid sick time after 80 hours of consecutive employment, at which point employees then accrue a minimum of one hour for every 30 hours worked, subject to the following limitations:

- Employees whose employers have 11-19 employees earn 40 hours of paid sick time in a year.
- Employees whose employers have 20 or more employees earn 56 hours of paid sick time in a year.

Employers are permitted to select higher limits of accrual and use.

### REASONS FOR USE OF SICK TIME

Employees may use accrued paid sick time for the following reasons:

- The employee's illness, injury, or health condition; or for treatment, diagnosis, or preventative medical care.
- Care of the employee's family members for illness, injury, or health condition; or for treatment, diagnosis, or preventative medical care.
- Meetings related to the employee's child's illness, injury, health condition, at school or care provider.
- Closure of the employee's business or to care for a child due closure of school or place of care by order of public official due to public health emergency.
- The employee's need to self-isolate or care for a family member that needs to isolate due to a communicable disease as determined by a health authority or a health care professional.

#### **USE OF SICK TIME**

 Paid sick time shall be provided upon the request of the employee with the expected duration of absence when possible.

- An employer that requires notice of the need to use paid sick time, must provide a written policy that contains reasonable procedures for employees to provide notice.
  - An employer with no written policy shall not deny paid sick time based on noncompliance with such policy.
- An employer shall not require an employee to search for or find a replacement worker to cover the employee's paid sick time.
- Paid sick time may be used in either hourly increments or smaller increments if the employer's payroll system accounts for absences in those smaller increments.
- An employer may require reasonable documentation for use of paid sick time beyond three consecutive workdays.

#### **RIGHTS**

The Act provides employees with the following rights:

- · Right to use paid sick time protected under the Act.
- Right to file a suit or complaint if paid sick time as required by the Act is denied by the employer or the employee is subjected to retaliatory personnel action for requesting or taking paid sick time.
- · Right to participate in an investigation, hearing, or proceeding.
- Right to inform any person of the person's potential rights under the Act.

#### RETALIATION PROHIBITED

Retaliatory personnel action against employees who request or use paid sick time is prohibited.

An employer's absence control policy shall not count paid sick time taken under the Act as an absence that may lead to or result in a retaliatory personnel action or other adverse action.

Questions about rights and responsibilities under the Act may be directed to the Nebraska Department of Labor - Labor Standards Division.



### **Additional Rules:**

- 1. We recommend drawings no larger than 3 x 5 but there is no limit to size.
- 2. You must obtain permission from the owner of the sidewalk or area you are using, or if a public sidewalk the owner of the property surrounding it. For public spaces, please contact the local city, school, or other public authority.
- 3. Drawings on buildings, trees, or any other surface are strictly prohibited.
- 4. This is a family event. Artwork containing nudity, profanity, or content deemed inappropriate by the committee will be disgualified from the contest. (Keep it rated G)
- 5. Final chalk designs should be free-hand drawn.
- 6. There is no limit to the number of drawings submitted.
- 7. Use chalk only. You may mix chalk dust with water but no other liquid substances may be used.
- 8. Do not use hairspray or any other chemicals to adhere the chalk to the sidewalk.

### Tips:

- Use chalk sparingly.
- Build up your layers, starting with a very light layer on the bottom. Some artists prefer to lay all their undertones first. Some prefer to work top to bottom.
- We recommend outlining all your major elements first.
- A big chalkboard eraser works great for laying down large areas of color. Moving the eraser in a circular motion works best.
- Creating a chalk-paint by crushing chalk into water and using a paint brush is also helpful when filling large areas.
- If you're a first timer, consider using one object as the focal point of your artwork a face, a compass, etc.
- Small details are difficult to manage on a rough surface so think BIG & DRAMATIC.
- The more you work with chalk on concrete, the more comfortable you will become. So, practice on the driveway at home before you create your final art!
